

Christmas Party

Fire Permits

It important that all residents understand the legal requirements if they wish to light any fire in the open during the Bush Fire Danger Season which began in 1st October. Fire permits are available from:

Peter Lawrence (48 898 004) or Michael Course (48 898 645)

Upon receiving the permit, residents will observe further conditions including the requirement to notify neighbours at least 24 hours before lighting the fire.

Follow-up to Public Meeting

The Brigade will hold a follow-up public meeting to the successful one held earlier this year. It will be held on Friday night 9th November at the Village Hall. This will be a more practical meeting to provide residents with safety and survival strategies. If attending, please bring with you a woollen blanket, your first aid kit, a container of water and your car. Supper will be provided at the end of the evening.

Membership Meetings

Bush Fire Danger Season - Permits Required for all fires

The Bush fire danger period came into force on 1st October. Wingecarribee Shire Council grants approval for the burning of dry vegetation in the open or in an incinerator on properties located in or around Balmoral under the following conditions:

1. Before any burning can be carried out during the Bushfire Danger Season, a FIRE PERMIT MUST BE OBTAINED from the Local Rural Fire Service Captain.

Only dry and dead vegetation originating on the property may be burned.

3. Plastics, rubber, chemical and pesticide containers and also the following specifically prohibited articles shall not be burned in conjunction with this approval. Tyres, coated wire, paint/solvent containers and residues; timber treated with copper chromium arsenate (CCA) or pentachlororophenol (PCP)

4. Burning with this approval must at all times be carried out by such practical means as are necessary to prevent or minimise air pollution. The potential for smoke impacting on any person due to wind direction and weather conditions must be taken into account.

In the event of a Total Fire Ban being declared, this approval is suspended. Any existing fire is to be extinguished and cannot be re-commenced until the Total Fire Ban is lifted.

In the event of a No Burn Day being declared by the EPA this approval is suspended for the duration of the declaration.


Note: This approval does not extend to the burning of vegetation which has been cleared for commercial development (not including commercial agriculture) or building construction.

PENALTY FOR OFFENCES

FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH THIS APPROVAL MAY RESULT IN AN ON THE SPOT FINE OF \$500 FOR AN INDIVIDUAL OR \$1000 FOR A CORPORATION. IN THE EVENT OF PROSECUTION, THE MAXIMUM PENALTY IS \$5 500 FOR AN INDIVIDUAL AND \$11 000 FOR A CORPORATION Pg 6
