THIEVES RUN RAMPANT IN NORTHERN VILLAGES!

On Tuesday, 3rd June, two Balmoral Village homes were broken into.


Ransacking one home and garage in Station Street and breaking into the garages of a home on River Street the thieves were able to abscond in broad daylight.

The thieves appeared to have shopping lists of goods which included Chainsaws, Blower Vacs, stereo equipment.

A resident of Balmoral advised that they observed a dark blue hatchback or small vehicle with two people acting strangely on Tuesday. Since then, Hill Top residents have had homes and cars broken into and the Take-Away shop has been broken into twice this week. The storage area for another shop complex was also broken into as well as the Hill Top Public School.

Further, the recently restored Colo Vale Train Station has also been the subject of a break -in.

The Vandalism Committee, a sub-committee of the Mittagong Chamber of Commerce has been advised of these issues as it closely monitors all crime in the shire.



Bowral Police advise that their forensics team are working on all of the recent break-ins and they have stepped up patrols to the Northern Villages.

Please ensure that your properties are secured when you leave and report any suspicious people to the police immediately. Local businesses may need to consider further security steps including security camera's.

Balmoral Village Volunteer Rural Fire Brigade during the burn season (winter) meets the first Wednesday of the Month at the Fire Shed 7:30pm. Members of the community wishing to join or just require information or advice are more than welcome to come along on these evenings.


During the current burn season the brigade will be meeting on Fridays and some weekends to conduct prescribed hazard reductions, weather permitting. Residents of the Village should be aware that smoke may be present during these times. Towards the end of this season a large burn to the northeast of the Village in the vicinity of Weir Road will be conducted over several days this may bring Brigades in from out-of-area to assist in this Hazard Reduction.

You may have noticed Incident Tape adjacent to the existing Fire Shed. This is due to work commencing shortly for the construction of a new Fire Station by the Wingecarribee Rural Fire Service. The existing Shed will receive a makeover and become a training facility & office for the Brigade.



BE CONSIDERATE ON LOCAL ROADS....

We often forget that speed zones on local roads are not there to be a nuisance.

Stopping distances, when faced with a pedestrian, child on a bike, native animal or pet, are of utmost importance as is the distance that you can see ahead.

Take the corner on Railway Pde which heads from the residential hamlet towards River Street. Admittedly, it is overgrown on the left and also narrow—how far can you see ahead as you approach that corner?

Stopping at 50km per hour will take around 44 metres, and at 60km, will take 58 metres¹. If you faced a neighbor walking on the left side of road going in the opposite direction to you—would you be able to avoid an accident?

Local roads require the local community to set the standards and be considerate to other road users <u>in</u> the interests of safety for all.

Be a good neighbor and stick to the speed limits around Balmoral—it could save a life.

Dumb things seen on our local roads:

Teenagers car surfing down Railway Parade (that means one teenager is riding on the roof of the car)

Drivers being harassed for sticking to the speed limit or just under in the event of poor visibility

Excessive speed on dirt roads

REGIONAL SHOOTING COMPLEX—UPDATE

A public hearing held in Hill Top on 30th May re-affirmed the communities strong opposition to the proposal for the Shooting Complex development in Hill Top.

Around 60 locals attended the hearing which ran from 11am till 5pm and was conducted via an Independent Expert Panel including Hon. Ian Armstrong (ex National Party MP) a noise expert and a planning expert.

There were 23 verbal submissions presented to the Panel including submissions from the Southern Highlands Regional Shooting Complex Inc, the National Parks Association, the Colong Foundation, and a number of expert advisors on behalf of the Hill Top Residents Action Group.

Key evidence was provided by the HTRAG consultants including not only the presence of Yel-Bellied Gliders (endangered), but the existence of 2 colonies within the 16 hectare area to be cleared. Further evidence was provided as to the nature of the site which was found by Dr Anne-Marie Clements to be an ecological sensitive sandstone/shale forest which could, on its own merits, warrant the development being refused.

The panel appeared to be considerate of all the submissions presented and will now consider the evidence and provide the Minister for Planning, Frank Sartor with a recommendation by the end of July.



We play Wednesdays at 10am - 2pm. We alternate with Hilltop Tennis Club, playing one Wednesday at our court and the following week at the Hilltop court.


The Balmoral Tennis Court can be hired any time.
