### Balmoral Village Reserve - Opposite the hall

There has a been a lot of history and communication on this council owned block over the years. Members of the BVA have recently met with a representative of Wingecarribee Shire Council at the site. Council have said their understanding of how things currently stand are:

- Within the Developer Contributions Plan there is money identified for Balmoral Village Green Passive Park.
- Wilson Drive Footpath Project there was \$150k allocated in the 2021/22 Capital Program for the delivery of a footpath along Wilson Drive from Hall St to the railway level crossing.

Progression of the project largely stalled upon discovery on the reserve containing both Hairy Geebung and Mittagong Geebung which are both listed as endangered flora within NSW. In light of the recent habitat investigation and internal collaboration, council are now confident that they are able to proceed with works within the



cleared area and APZ. But no works are permitted within the uncleared areas.

With all this in mind, their proposal is for a concept design to be made up internally, showing the Wilson Dr footpath now passing through the cleared area of Balmoral Reserve, gated at either end, with some park furniture & a low maintenance play space located along it. They will put the concept design up for community consultation, then look to finalise it based upon feedback received.

## Banana Cake Recipe

#### **INGREDIENTS:**

- 4 Medium Ripe bananas (1 ½ cups mashed)
- ½ cup (125ml) light flavoured olive oil
- 3 eggs
- 1 1/2 cups (265g) brown sugar
- 2 teaspoons vanilla extract
- 1 ½ cups (225g) self-raising flour
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon

#### METHOD:

- 1. Preheat oven to 180 degrees. Place the bananas in a bowl and mash with a fork. Add the oil, eggs, sugar and vanilla and mix to combine. Add the flour and cinnamon and mix to combine.
- Pour into a 22cm round cake tin lined with non-stick baking paper. Cook for 45 mins or until a skewer comes
  out clean. Allow to stand in the tin for 5 minus before turning out onto a wire rack to cool completely. Serves 810



#### **Village Hall Works**

You may have noticed further work occurring at the Village Hall over the past few weeks. We are very happy to be making positive changes to the hall and its grounds.

- The toilets have just been renovated, with the installation of new cisterns, pans and tiled floors. They are about to be painted internally to make them much nicer.
- Thanks to the "Black Summer Bushfire Recovery Grants" the Association are currently doing an electrical upgrade to the hall and providing a new power link down to the tennis clubhouse. Other grants from Wingecarribee Council and St Vincent de Paul have given the Association the funds to provide lighting to the tennis/basketball court and outdoor lighting for the hall, the grounds and the tennis clubhouse. You will see further work on these projects over the next couple of weeks.
- Additionally, an extensive camera security system is being installed, covering the buildings and grounds of the hall. This will provide much needed security as we improve the infrastructure in and around the hall and court.
- The two slabs near the court are awaiting the installation of two pavilions with electric BBQ and picnic table sets.
- Following the electrical installations, the Association will be working towards installing paths and gardens.

# IMPORTANT NOTICE REGARDING FIRE PERMITS AND THE FIRE DANGER PERIOD WITHIN THE SOUTHERN HIGHLANDS AREA:

The Bush Fire Danger Period within the Wollondilly and Wingecarribee LGA's **DOES NOT COMMENCE until the 1st of October 2022.** 

Fire Permits will be required to undertake pile burning activities from that date and will be available from your local RFS Captain.



The new Fire Danger Ratings have four levels instead of six- Moderate, High,

Extreme and Catastrophic. When there is minimal risk, such as when it is raining,

'No Rating' will be used. This the white wedge sitting under Moderate.

There are actions for each level, so you will know what to do to protect your life, family and property. You can check the daily fire danger rating on the RFS website, in the Fires Near Me NSW smartphone app, or look out for the roadside signs.
